


Culture in three unique destinations

Lake Tuusula is one of the most famous attractions of Tuusula. More than a century ago, an exceptional artists' community was established in the area, following in the footsteps of celebrated Finnish writer Aleksis Kivi. Later, author Juhani Aho also attracted fellow artists to the region who left a legacy behind them that would have a longstanding impact on Finnish art and culture. The Lake Tuusula artists' community was the birthplace of a national movement that instigated the cultural enrichment of our nation as we strode toward independence.

While a short day trip will give you a taste of the region's distinct artistic heritage, there are ample opportunities to dig a bit deeper and spend an entire trip learning and exploring Lake Tuusula's creative history. At 8 km in length, the lake is contoured by a narrow and meandering 20-kilometre hiking trail, which is mostly flat. Many of the artists' homes, of which the most famous ones are Halosenniemi and Erkkola, are located along the lake's eastern coastal road (Rantatie). You can also explore the scenery and the region's cultural treasures by bike.

Kellokoski, located in the northern Tuusula, intersects a full spectrum of the history of a manor, crofters, ironworks and its workers, and a hospital and its patients. The old ironworks is the heart of Kellokoski. While the workers may have long since left their posts, visitors can still sense the atmosphere of the old factory as they wander in and through the alleys. At the centre of Kellokoski, from the top of the rapids and the dam, visitors can enjoy a view that captures the history of the whole village. The Kellokoski Ironworks Factory Museum displays examples of the metal products manufactured in the ironworks, as well as pictures and maps of the development of the town and ironworks area. The Kellokoski Hospital Museum offers visitors interesting stories of the hospital, the history of the patients, and the advances of psychiatric treatment.

The population centre Jokela, located in northern Tuusula, grew around the railway. A brick factory was established, and bricks made of clay from Jokela and other manufactured products were transported to the customers via train. The factory buildings and the ponds that were created as a result of clay digging are still today prominent landmarks of Jokela. At the heart of the brick factory lies a 57-metre long tyre oven built in the 1930s. The oven and its shelter building, the artificial dryers, and the factory canteen are all open to the public. The story behind this historic site and the future of the area as a whole is complemented by a series of displays. The ponds and the natural environment of Jokela have attracted whooper swans, who still come to nest and raise their young in the area.

AHOLA

Writer Juhani Aho and painter Venny Soldan-Brofeldt lived in Ahola from 1897. After falling in love with the area, Juhani Aho went on to entice other artists to Lake Tuusula, and so the notable community of artists began. Visitors to Ahola can immerse themselves in the life's work of this artistic couple and enjoy the summertime exhibition, which changes annually. AINOLA

The composer Jean Sibelius and his family made Ainola their home in 1904 and went on to live there for the next 65 years. A visit to the Ainola estate and its surrounding courtyard buildings, which have all been preserved in their original state, is a unique journey back in time to the sights and sounds of domestic life, music, and visual art of the last century. Ainola is surrounded by a beautiful garden, which is also the burial place of the composer and his wife Aino. Café Aulis and a museum shop serve customers adjacent to the tickets office.

ALEKSIS KIVI'S MEMORIAL COTTAGE

A visit to the memorial home of Aleksis Kivi, one of Finland's greatest authors, allows you to sample what life was like in and around Lake Tuusula before the artists' community became established. The cottage originally belonged to Kivi's brother and his family. Aleksis Kivi himself only lived there for the last few months of his life in 1872. The small cottage and courtyard is impressive in its modesty.

Romantic studio home built by the painter Pekka Halonen in 1902. Halosenniemi, which has been lovingly restored to its original state, is now an art museum showcasing the work of Halonen and other artists from the Lake Tuusula artists' community. 

KELLOKOSKI CHURCH

A wooden church painted with red ochre is located in a beautiful spot by the impounding reservoir of Kellokoski. It was built by the ironmaster Lars Olof Nysten in about 1800. The crown motifs of the stained glass windows and the bell tower were built in the 1930s during the period of ironmaster Totti Carlander.

TUUSULA CHURCH

Tuusula's timber-framed church is one of the oldest surviving cruciform churches in Finland. It was inaugurated in 1734. The church adopted its current colour scheme, designed by Pekka Halonen, in 1927. The church's simple décor, stained glass windows, and its altarpiece decorated by Johan Asplund in the 1850s, all lend the church an intimate atmosphere. Aleksis Kivi and Pekka Halonen are among other persons of note buried in the church grounds.

TUUSULA WORKERS' HOME MUSEUM

The workers' home museum in the district of Kirkkomäki includes a shoemaker's workshop, a carpenter's family home, and a blacksmith's workshop, all presenting the life of rural craftsmen in the early 20th century. The museum also hosts themed exhibitions related to the artisan tradition and various demonstrations of crafts and other artisan techniques, such as the art of spinning and carding wool, tar burning, cutting woodchips with a shingle cutting machine and blacksmithing.

Nature in Tuusula

Tuusula has versatile landscapes and natural attractions, including forests, cliffs, vast fields, and waterways. Lake Tuusula has been nominated as the regional lake of Helsinki-Uusimaa region. The artists who lived on the shores of the lake at the turn of the 19th and 20th centuries immortalized it in numerous works of art, and so it became part of what is popularly referred to as the Finnish 'soul landscape' (sielunmaisema). With its stunning surroundings, Lake Tuusula is an absolute natural gem in this part of Finland. The lake is also categorised as an area of national significance for bird life. There are many natural attractions in the surrounding area, and the area is popular among active visitors: you can take part in a Jolly Boat race or enjoy skiing, Nordic skating, or cycling.

Other attractions worth visiting include, for example, the research forests of the Finnish Forest Research Institute in the village of Ruotsinkylä.
In Tuusula, nature is everywhere around you.

SARVIKALLIO

Sarvikalliontie, Tuusula

Sarvikallio is a popular year-round excursion destination. The highest point on the shores of Lake Tuusula rises to a height of 25 metres from the lake surface. It is nice to enjoy your snacks and admire the lake scenery opening from the top of the cliffs, which fall sharply into the lake. The old villas on the opposite shore remind us that we are in a significant cultural environment where the colourful artist community of Lake Tuusula once flourished.

Sarvikallio was an important place also for the members of the artist community. Venny Soldan-Brofeldt, Pekka Halonen and Eero Järnefelt often painted there, and they took hikes to the cliffs with their families. For Eero Järnefelt, the place reminded him of the rugged national landscapes found in Koli in Eastern Finland, and he named Sarvikallio "Little Koli".

The forest trails of Sarvikallio can be found behind the parking area and they run towards the vantage point. On the trails you can experience both the dimness of the old forest and

the light of the birch woods. The trail routes and driveway run to the rest area, where you can find firewood and a place for making a fire. There are two earth-closets in the area, and stairs have been constructed down from the vantage point all the way to the pebbles of the Sarvikallio beach. You can also arrive at Sarvikallio by rowing boat. Rent a boat at Museum Halosenniemi or Hotel Gustavelund. Sarvikallio is easily accessible from many directions, both by driving and using public transportation, and it is also a suitable destination for a bike tour. The area at the top of Sarvikallio is a highly valued nature reserve.

FJÄLLBO PARK

Aleksis Kiven kuja, Tuusula

Situated close to the many attractions on Tuusula's Rantatie coastal road, the beautiful Fjällbo Park is a popular recreation area alongside Lake Tuusula. Fjällbo can be found near the parking area shared by the Aleksis Kivi memorial cottage and the Erkkola estate. In days gone by, the park was home to an old villa, which is nowadays commemorated by a charming old gazebo and a stone staircase leading down to the lakeside.

The rocky cliffs of the park and the coastal walking paths provide you with tranquil setting to enjoy the area's nature and the beauty of the lake scenery. On the opposite shore lies the Sarvikallio recreation area. There are also benches and a campfire site dotted along the trail. A new playground with play cottages can be found close to the car park.

THE SEVEN BROTHERS HIKING TRAIL

The 'Seven Brothers' trail is a 90 km long hiking route from Helsinki to Hyvinkää. The journey passes through several forested and urban sites associated with Aleksis Kivi's renowned novel, *The Seven Brothers*. The route can be completed in short day trips or as multi-day hike, and has rest facilities and dining, washing, and accommodation services along the way. Some sections of the trail are also suitable for skiing and cycling.

The Tuusula leg of the trail runs through the forest paths of the Ruotsinkylä Research Forest and leads through the River Tuusula valley and Lahela bike paths to the cultural landscape of Nahkela. The Tuusula leg is about 15 kilometres in length.

Available for smartphones, the handy Citynomadi app provides information on the local nature, history, personalities, and events, and also provides fitness and stretching advice.

RESEARCH FOREST IN RUOTSINKYLÄ

Tuusula's research forest in Ruotsinkylä offers visitors an excellent opportunity to familiarise themselves with rich and diverse woodland nature. The nature of the forests include, for example, bare cliffs, fresh and dry pine forests, and brooks running through lush groves. The Raitio Trail has activities that you can view with the QR scanner of your mobile phone. You can look for answers to the questions from the surrounding nature. At Professor Pytinki's campfire site, visitors can take a short break and enjoy snacks.

PICNIC AREA ON THE BEACH AT ANTILA FARM CENTRE

Tähtientie, Tuusula

A picnic area has been built on the beach area of the Anttila farm centre located on the shores of Lake Tuusula. There are several picnic tables and two multi-purpose grills suitable for preparing, for example, sausages or pancakes on the fire. While tasting your snacks, you can admire Lake Tuusula's beautiful scenery.

LAKE TUUSULA WETLANDS

Lake Tuusula has been designated a nationally significant wetland habitat for birds, and monitoring data can be traced back to the 1940s. Several species of bird nest and stopover in the Lake Tuusula region. The special Natura area consists of three separate shore and wetland areas around Lake Tuusula. The area in the Natura site of most ornithological significance is in Järvenpää, at the northern end of Lake Tuusula. As many as 46 breeding species of birds have been recorded in the area between Linturanta and the northern end of the lake. At the northern end of the lake, there is a birdwatching tower that can be accessed by following a boardwalk ("Jouko's path"), which starts from Harjuvaarankuja street. Information boards about the bird life and plants found in the area are dotted along the route.



Things to do in Tuusula

There are plenty of things to do amidst Tuusula's nature, and you can try some new activities as well. The fitness trails can be used for walking and running during the snow-free period and for skiing during the winter. You should try, for example, the fitness trails of Tuusula Sports Centre and Jokela. The trails are for everyone: mountain bikers, trail runners, trekkers, and people walking their dogs.

Disc golf can be played in several locations.

There are plenty of activities to do all year round in the Lake Tuusula area.

Cycling round the lake is a popular way to explore the scenery and local attractions. You can also go fishing, rowing, canoeing, sailing, and swimming in the lake during the summer months. In winter, the lake attracts walkers, skiers and Nordic skaters.

Bikes, boats, Nordic skates, kicksleds, snowshoes, and other sports equipment can be hired from several outlets. Shopping, escape games, theatre, and other cultural events, as well as a wide range of restaurants, ensure that there's plenty to keep you entertained in Tuusula – whatever the weather.

Things to **do all year**



BIKE ROUND THE LAKE

While you can comfortably cycle round Lake Tuusula in no more than an hour, you can also spend a whole day stopping to enjoy the many points of interest along the route. The road runs through a beautiful cultural landscape and is surrounded by several well-known artists' homes, cafés, and restaurants. You can also enjoy a picnic in one of the local parks.

The route is a circuit and most of it follows a bike track or the quiet museum road through pleasantly varying surroundings. Bike hire is available, making cycling an ideal way of leisurely taking in the sights.

Bike hire points in summer time:

In the Lake Tuusula area, bicycles are available for rent in the summer, for example, at Sportuna sportuna.fi. More information on the service providers is available at visittuusula.fi under See and do » Activities In the summer.

other hand, offers higher speeds while cyclists can enjoy a close connection to nature on the narrow rural and forest roads. The routes are always tailored to meet the participants' wishes on both off-road and gravel tours.

EXPLORE THE FITNESS TRAILS AND OUTDOOR ROUTES

Fitness trails and outdoor routes can be found in several parts of Tuusula, and they are intended for all kinds of users: mountain bikers, trail runners, trekkers, and people walking their dogs. Visitors can use the trails and routes in a responsible manner: Finland's "everyman's right" sets the rules.

Visit the following places, for example:

The route round Alho pond runs close to the shore of the pond in the forest. This easy terrain route is located in Jokela. The route, suitable for the whole family, features Story Path signs and activity cards, allowing visitors to observe, explore, and try a variety of things in the local nature.

Annivaara Trail is a 2-kilometre circular route that starts at Annivaara's parking area. The trail is accessible, but has a couple of steep hills. There are also other paths along the trail that are worth visiting.

Syvälähti Park's Arts Path begins at Kellokoski Beach (Saunarannankuja), follows the riverside, and finishes at Omenalahti Bridge. The path is short with a variable surrounding nature and there are art installations and benches along the path.

GO FISHING OR ICE FISHING

Rent a boat and go fishing on Lake Tuusula. Bait casting and trolling with a single rod and troll are permitted with a county-specific permit for lure fishing (for persons aged 18 to 64). Fishing and ice fishing are everyman's rights, the exercise of which does not need to be authorised as provided for in the Fishing Act. Snare fishing always requires a permit by participants' association. There are six independent participants' associations in Lake Tuusula, whose information and separate rules can be found on kalastaja.info (only in Finnish).

NORDIC SKATING OR SKIING ON THE LAKE ICE

See up-to-date information about the ski trails located at Lake Tuusula and elsewhere in Tuusula at tuusula.fi/hiihtoladut. You can also find versatile ski trails at the the Tuusula Sports Centre in Tuusula. The starting point is Kilpailukuja 7, Tuusula. Tracks are also made at Tuusula Golf Course and elsewhere in Tuusula, depending on the weather conditions. Excellent ski trails can also be found in, for example, Jokela (Notkokuisto) and Kellokoski (Sairaanpuisto).

Both a Nordic skating route and cross-country skiing tracks are maintained on Lake Tuusula during winter. You can easily access the lake ice from Gustavelund Hotel, the Onnela region of Krapí, Sarvikallio vantage point, or Anttilanranta. Conditions on the lake vary every winter, so all safety instructions provided by those maintaining the activities must be followed. 
